
Preparedness Day 2019

On September 24 the Center for Disaster Research and Education hosted its 6th Annual Preparedness Day event. Twenty nine organizations participated including a number of student organizations, university departments and offices also participated in the event to promote related programs and initiatives. The event was held at the Student Memorial Center Promenade at Millersville University. The event focused on the importance of preparedness and aimed to encourage participants to complete a preparedness pledge and take steps to be better prepared at the individual level. Preparedness Day 2019 included a larger number of participants and external vendors compared to previous years. IAEM Region 3 Symposium

Millersville University hosted the fall 2019 IAEM Region III Symposium on September 24. This day also marked the 6th Annual Preparedness Day sponsored by the Center for Disaster Research and Education. Over 15 professional organizations including but not limited to FEMA, LEMA, National Weather Service (State College, PA Office), American Red Cross, PA Department of Health participated in this event open to all at the university and the greater community.

The IAEM meeting was attended by members from Delaware, Maryland, West Virginia, Virginia, DC, and Pennsylvania. Student representatives of the Student Chapter of the International Association of Emergency Managers and the Master of Science in Emergency Management program presented during the opening of the symposium. The event provided many networking opportunities for students who were present, and Millersville was honored to host this year's event.

CERT Fall 2019

The Community Emergency Response Team or CERT is a FEMA program offered in the fall and spring semesters by the CDRE. This training allows participants to learn about the fundamentals of preparedness and to be certified to assist in disasters. Millersville University CDRE has been offering CERT training since 2010 and the training is open to all Millersville University staff, students, faculty and the greater community. CERT training covers every major element of disaster and topics such as Disaster Preparedness, Fire Safety, Disaster Medical Operations, Light Search and Rescue Operations, Disaster Psychology, Terrorism, and Hazardous Weather. Instructors for Fall 2019 were Duane Halgelgans, Paul Benyeda, Tammi Snedeker, Alex Redcay, and Ann Harach. The dates for Spring 2020 classes will be April 18th-April 19th. and April 25th.
