# **Legislative UPDATE**

#### Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education

The House holds its only legislative session this week. **Capitolwire** reports the chamber may turn its focus to imposing a severance tax on natural gas. "More than 370 amendments have been introduced to House Bill 1401, a bill that would amend the state's Tax Code and is predicted to generate upwards of \$200 million in revenue for the state's General Fund."

The Senate stands in recess until Monday, December 11, 2017 at 1:00 p.m., unless sooner recalled by the President Pro Tempore.

During its legislative session last week, the chamber did not take action on any bills of interest on the Senate calendar, e.g., <u>SR 228</u> (Eichelberger) regarding a global education task force.

Executive Vice Chancellor Peter Garland represented interim chancellor Dr. Karen Whitney, who had a prior commitment out of state and is not able to attend Wednesday. On behalf of her and the Board of Governors, Dr. Garland <a href="mailto:spoke">spoke</a> with the committee about the recommendations contained in the strategic system review report by the National Center for Higher Education Management Systems (NCHEMS) and, more importantly, how the System has now shifted from "system review" to "system redesign" mode in

order to achieve the most positive results on behalf of and for our students, universities and the System as a whole/

NCHEMS' President Sally Johnstone also participated as well as <u>East Stroudsburg University President</u> Marcia Welsh and West Chester University President Christopher Fiorentino. Written testimony was submitted by <u>California University</u> of <u>Pennsylvania President Geraldine Jones</u> and <u>Millersville University</u>.
