

Early Learning STEM Classroom Groundbreaking

Millersville University will join officials from the [Community Action Partnership \(CAP\)](#), Eurofins, The Steinman Foundation and High Foundation today for a groundbreaking at Bard Hall. Bard will be renovated over the next couple of months to prepare for a Head Start program that will begin in spring semester.

The program, which will be an exceptional school readiness program with a focus in STEM, is for Millersville students who have children ages 3 or 4. Lancaster County Head Start is slated to open the STEM prototype classroom (Monday-Friday/full day) right here on Millersville University's campus. To qualify, families must have a gross income within 100% of the federal poverty guidelines.

The program will take 18 children. There are already seven signed up.
