VIDEOS

Academic Video Online (AVON) includes a variety of video material: documentaries, interviews, performances, news programs and newsreels, demonstrations, and raw footage. This resource contains 68,000 titles spanning a wide range of subject areas including anthropology, business, counseling, film, health, STEM, history, music, and more.

Digital Theatre+

Digital Theatre Plus provides online access to streaming video of over 450 classic, contemporary and international productions. Includes behind-the-scenes documentaries as well as teaching and learning resources to facilitate understanding of the productions and texts. in-depth interviews exploring the creative, technical theatre-making processes, as well as experimental, post-dramatic and applied theatre.



EBOOKS

These eBook collections provide unlimited user access and can be used as course readings. Professors who are looking to reduce the cost of books for students may wish to consider these and other library provided resources to supplement their course materials.

Oxford Scholarship Online

Oxford Scholarship Online provides access to over 15,000 academic eBooks in a wide variety of subject areas, with a concentration in the humanities and social sciences, in addition to sciences, medicine, and law.

SAGE Knowledge

SAGE Knowledge is a collection of just under 5,000 eBooks focused in the social sciences, including, business/management, counseling, criminology, education, geography, health/social care, media/communication, politics/international relations, psychology, and sociology.
